The Four Essential Questions

1. Does this enable teams or constrain them?

Good scaling removes blockers. Bad scaling creates approval layers.

2. Does this distribute decision-making or centralize it?

Agile scaling pushes decisions down to the most informed level.

Effective coordination keeps teams oriented toward customer value.

Decision Guide

-  **Proceed with confidence:** All four questions answered positively (enables, distributes, customer focus, learning)
-  **Proceed with caution:** Mixed answers or "unclear" responses — pilot first, evaluate quickly
-  **Reconsider:** Multiple negative answers — this approach likely harms agility
